Essential Components of Pathways Planning

- (1) Mapping pathways to student end goals
- (2) Helping students choose and enter a program pathway
- (3) Keeping students on the path
- (4) Ensuring that students are learning

Key Challenges

- (1) Colleges are trying to find a balance between providing too much and too little choice for students
- (2) Colleges should help every student develop a program plan and a clear career pathway in the first term
- (3) Colleges need to redesign advising practices to better support student progression into and through programs
- (4) Colleges need to take steps to help students complete their programs more quickly

Managing the Change Process at Pathways Colleges

- (1) Creating a climate for change: Colleges need to cultivate cultures of openness to change and innovation
- (2) Colleges should emphasize building and strengthening their capacity to analyze, report and use data
- (3) Colleges must have a strategic plan with clear, measurable goals for improving student outcomes
- (4) Engaging the whole organization: Colleges address the fear and anxiety that inevitably comes with changes
- (5) Pathways colleges need to invest in professional development that directly supports pathways implementation
