a. ACCJC Conference Debrief

Dr. Hamilton attended the new ALO training and Dr. Todd attended the new evaluator training. The newest edition of the Guide to Evaluating and Improving Institutions was discussed. The training doesn't seem to have a norming component to make sure all teams are grading on the same criteria. The institution set standards are widely interpreted differently. Some colleges in the state have really embraced integrated planning and may be used as a model for us as an institution. We are getting there with AtD and program review conversations. We have become a much more data driven college.

The Chancellor Eloy Ortiz stressed the need to address and improve completion rates and closing equity gaps.

b. QFE Discussion

MJC Quality Focus Essay project handouts were distributed showing action projects and desired goals. They are as follows: holistic support of student learning and student achievement, establishing clear educational pathways for students, and tie together achievement and outcome rates to program review.

c. Institutional Self-Evaluation Report Update

Scott Kerlin has presented the writing team with the first set of required data for the introduction. It will be reviewed next week. He looked at patterns and grouped narratives that seemed prescriptive like our IEPI data, yield rates, transfer data for UC and CSU schools. It is not built with internal data as much as data sources outside of the institution.
